What is Positive Behavioral Intervention and Support (PBIS)?

- <u>A framework</u> for evidence-based prevention and intervention practices that supports the academic, social, emotional, and behavioral capabilities of all students.
- A multi-tiered response to intervention



PBIS vs Traditional approaches to Student Behavior

PBIS

Proactive

 Focused on rewarding and teaching behavior

<u>Traditional</u>

- Reactive

- Focused on punishing behavior



Why does Riley need PBIS?

- Will help us achieve our school vision
 - "We envision that Riley Upper Elementary will be a safe environment in which our students will learn.
- Teachers will develop positive, predictable, and safe environments through learning the best practices to teach, model and encourage interpersonal relationships.

Multi-tiored Supports



Tier 1: focuses on preventing new behavior and the frequency of incidents.

Tier 2: More focused, intensive and frequent interventions

Tier 3: Individualized responses to situations



School-wide approach: Creating a team

- Will need a PBIS leadership team made up of staff from both 5th and 6th grade
- Will develop evidence-based practices to be sused throughout classrooms, hallways, lunchrooms, etc.
- Will check-in using data collection to monitor the progress of PBIS.



PBIS in the classroom

- Preventative and responsive approaches to behavior discussed with all students and intensified support for small group/individual students when needed.
- Systems in place to support classroom teachers with PBIS practices
- Data collection to identify patterns of strengths and needs.



PBIS for the student

- Receives recognition for expected behavior
- Experiences predictable reteaching for problem behavior
- Improvements in academic and social achievement



PBIS Data Collection

- Identify behavior that needs to be addressed
- Determine a timespan for intervention
- Set a goal for the student
- assessing how well core features of a practice or system are being implemented
